Rwanda have updated their clearance request procedure. Once you register you can apply for clearances directly. Otherwise you'll need to use an agent that are registered on their site. You can also upload the documents to the online system.

Hong Kong can be done on your own, and the first time will be the worst as there are several systems you need to register for. After the first time, it gets much easier, and permits can be obtained in just a few days.

Basically, you'll need to apply for Landing Permit, Parking, Handling, and Slot for each landing. Agents can do this, go with them if short notice. If you've got a couple of weeks before your very first flight, go ahead and give it a run yourself.

For South Korea permits, we recommend to apply directly to the CAA for overfly permits, and the agent for short notice and landing permits.

Your first contact with South Korea will likely lead to them mentioning they don't have record of you. They'll send a form to get set up, and beyond this, permits are straight forward.

Keep an eye on safeairspace.net for risk factors when flying over or to South Korea.

A permit is not required by the CAA for an overfly but they do need to receive notification and will acknowledge the flight. You should do this one day before your flight. Private landings you need to give notice via your handler one day in advance.

Commercial landings require a bit more work. Firstly, you need to get a Transport Security Program which takes 60 days to set up. Then, you need to get a permit from the CAA for the flights, and the cost is AUD570. More details: https://www.casa.gov.au/aircraft/standard-page/foreign-operators

Fill out, make payment, then email airportops@rmipa.com, letting them know you made payment, and you'd like your PPR number. If they don't have issues, you'll get a number. Otherwise, they'll ask you to land earlier/later, and on agreement, they'll give you the PPR number.

They are a bit slow, so you may need to call for information.





No permit is required for private flights or an overfly but you do need to make a declaration in advance. This is classed as a flight with less than 12 seats. So if you're a private flight with more than 12 seats you will be classed as commercial.

For commercial flights you need to make a permit application three days in advance for a single flight and seven days in advance for more than one flight.

When applying for the permit you'll need to fill in their specific forms and send with your application. Always chase your application with a phone call.

Standard application for Barbados, give a few days notice to be sure, and send to all the emails below. Give a phone call, they'll acknowledge, and let you know all is OK and when to expect the permit.

If you don't receive, give a call back one day prior to flight, and follow up. They are quite nice.

Permit is issued for day of flight only but you can amend by sending a follow up email.

You must pay the authorities for your permit at a cost of \$100, transferred to Instituto Nicaraguense de Aeronautica Civil INAC to account number 100-10915922-111 Banpro – Grupo ProAmerica.

You should use an agent here. Communications with the authorities are not good. You don't need an overfly permit but you do need to check in advance for Navigation Fees

For tech stops and private flights (not that we recommend it) with less than 72 hours on the ground do not need a permit.

Getting landing permits is the single worst experience in aviation. You must use an agent, and the process can take months (not kidding). Plan on costs over \$5000, sending original documents to be notarized, and assume you will not have a permit by flight date. It really is that bad.
